Observing Patriot Day: Honoring 9/11

Patriot Day is observed each year on 9/11, it is a time for us to pause and remember the lives lost. It is also a time for recognizing the courage and sacrifice of those who rose to the call in the aftermath. Countless men and women volunteered or continued their service, protecting our freedoms and supporting communities at home and abroad.

Key aspects of Patriot Day:

- Remembrance The day is dedicated to remembering the nearly 3,000 lives lost on 9/11.
- National Day of Service Acts of service reflecting the spirit of those who helped in the aftermath of the attacks.
- Presidential Proclamation Each year the President issues a proclamation calling for the display of flags at half-staff, moments of silence and remembrance ceremonies.
- Moment of Silence: A moment of silence is observed at 8:46
 Eastern Standard time, the time the first plane struck the World Trade Center.

- Focus on Diversity and Leadership:
 Electing the first woman National
 Commander and supporting
 leadership diversity to reflect the
 evolving veteran community.

First female national commander—Commander-in-Chief—of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW)



Carol Whitmore made history on August 13, 2025, when she became the first female national commander—Commander-in-Chief—of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), elected at the organization's 126th National Convention in Columbus, Ohio. Not only is she the first woman to lead the storied, more than 125-year-old veterans' organization, but she is also the first Iowan to hold the position.

Whitmore's military journey began when she enlisted in 1977 and went on to have a distinguished 36-year career. Serving as a first sergeant, she earned her VFW eligibility during Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq. Her accolades include the Legion of Merit Medal, Bronze Star Medal, six Army Commendation Medals, the Iraq Campaign Medal, and the Combat Action Badge, among others.

After joining VFW Post 9127 in Des Moines, Iowa, in 2012, Whitmore achieved All-American status as Iowa Department Commander in 2018–2019 and went on to serve in multiple national leadership roles. In her acceptance speech, Whitmore reflected on her role as a trailblazer, declaring: "I may be the first veteran to have been elected VFW commander-in-chief while wearing a dress ... but I will not be the last! ... I am your comrade by mud, by blood, by dust, by dirt, by sand, by land, by sea, by air ... I am a veteran first".

Her leadership signals a new era of inclusion and representation for women veterans while reinforcing the VFW's mission to serve all who have worn the uniform. Whitmore's election is not only a testament to her commitment and vision but also marks a significant milestone for the entire veteran community.
